CLASS MASSES

NUTS IN SCHOOL

We have a number of children currently in our school that can have severe allergic reactions to peanuts and other nuts. This allergic reaction (anaphylactic shock) can occur through ingestion of peanut/nut products, cross contamination and breathing peanuts in the air. Since this condition can be life threatening, we are asking for your help in minimising the risk to these children by:

- a) Avoiding giving children peanuts in school lunches
- b) Avoiding giving peanut butter sandwiches, other spreads containing nuts such as Nutella and snacks/bars containing nuts or labelled 'may contain nut traces' in school lunches
- c) Asking children not to share their lunches
- d) Making sure hand and faces are washed if nut products have been eaten before school.

Due to the potential severity of the problem, it is important that all parents and carers carry out the suggested measures and reduce the risk of any allergic reactions.

SAFE PARKING

We have once again had some upset residents and parents.

Please take care when parking and driving around the school environment. Please remember that on the church park you should only park in a space and not on the path. Doing this is endangering our children's lives. Please drive slowly and carefully on Belgrave Street and do not park in front of residents driveways.
